Portrait Parties are an exciting opportunity for you and your friends to have professional portraits made in a fun and affordable way. Portrait Parties take place in your home (if you are the host) or any other suitable location.

The host invites between 4 and 12 families to the party and with each purchase your friends make, you earn credits toward your own purchases. It is a low stress, fun opportunity to have beautiful portraits made of yourself or your children in a low pressure, relaxed atmosphere.

You, and each guest family, will be scheduled for a 20 minute photography session. In that time period, we will capture as many images as possible. Remember that it is our goal for you and your guests to be as comfortable as possible and for you to have a wide range of poses to choose from. We want everyone to walk away with not only great pictures, but a fun and memorable experience.

You invite 4-12 guest and their families. As your guests enjoy the party, each family has a free 20 minute portrait session. In this fun, low pressure atmosphere everyone has a good time and the children will actually look forward to the next party!

After the party, each guest family will receive and email with a link to a secure gallery on the Photography by Toine website to view their portraits. The host collect orders from their guests and 2-4 weeks later deliver the final products to each family. After all guests have ordered the host will then be able to place an order based on credits from their guests purchases.



Toine is a professional photographer who specializes in portraits and weddings. He was introduced to photography at an early age by his talented father, Kees. Together, they would spend countless hours taking pictures, and developing them in their own darkroom. His father taught him the important basics of composition, exposure, as well as how to look at situations from unusual vantage points.
